Qualitative analysis of Criterion 1

The college follows the academic calendar and curriculum framed by the affiliating university. An academic committee prepares the guidelines. IQAC prepares teaching plan and academic calendar and individual teachers are encouraged to prepare an active plan for classroom teaching. Teachers, individually, maintain their diaries which reflect the teaching plan and other academic activities of the year.

A number of teachers are members of Boards of Studies of the affiliating university and offer suggestions given by faculties regarding syllabus. Identification of slow learners and fast learners is done at the entry level through a knowledge based test. Slow learners are provided remedial coaching and fast learners are encouraged through special coaching in advanced areas. ICT enabled teaching is adopted by most of the teachers. Review of the progress of syllabus completion is done periodically at the department level meetings. CBCS and Elective Course system is implemented in U.G and P.G. programmes. Field visits and study tours are conducted for experiential learning.

Feedback related to curriculum is collected from stakeholders, analysed and efforts are made to implement the suggestions. Teachers are encouraged to attend faculty development programmes for improving their knowledge level. Comprehensive evaluation is adopted through unit tests. Academic audit is done every year.

All the students are from the same state. Teaching-learning and Evaluation process is done as per the affiliating university norms. An Entry Level Test is conducted at classroom level which helps in identifying the Slow and Advanced learners. Remedial classes are arranged for Slow learners. In addition to the traditional methods, the institute adopts participative, student centric learning. Field visits, and study tours are encouraged. ICT enabled Smart class rooms are used by teachers to provide virtual experience to the students. E-learning resources and well-equipped laboratories also support considerably. Software like Moodle is adopted by some faculty members. Evaluation is as per the guidelines of the affiliating University. Examination Committee takes care of the process of continuous evaluation in the form of Unit Tests, Common Tests, Projects, Seminars, Assignments, Group Discussions and practical Examinations. The examination grievances of the students are addressed as per the guidelines of the university. IQAC prepares an Academic Calendar keeping in view of the guidelines given by the university. Mentorship is adopted for good academic interaction between teachers and students. Question bank is available at the department. Add-on -courses and soft skill course are introduced. Twenty Six teachers are with Ph.D. Many sanctioned teaching posts remain vacant. Total transparency is maintained in internal examination as per university norms. Students are provided the answer books to verify their marks. University appointed examination nodal officer sorts out the issues, if any raised by the students. On-line student satisfaction survey regarding teachinglearning process is adopted.

The college has received Rs. 18.36 Lakhs for 16 Minor Research Projects. Eleven teachers are recognised research Guides for Ph.D. 28% teachers are recognised guides. The number of Ph.Ds awarded per faculty is as low as 2.7. Research Cell constituted for promotion of research culture among faculty. Some programmes were conducted on IPR and Industry-Academia Innovative practices. Faculty members have published 160 research papers in journals, 100 in conference proceedings, and 31 books/ book chapters. Five teachers have participated in overseas International Conferences and one among them chaired a session. UGC Code of Conduct to check malpractices and plagiarism in research adopted. Fourteen seminars /workshops on different topics were conducted during the last five years.

NSS and NCC conducts extension activities like tree planting, blood donation, swachha bharat, water conservation methods, seed-ball programme etc. The college has MOUs with NGOs for society related activities. Three teachers have received awards for extension activities. Five MOUs are in operation.

The college campus area is 2 acres with built-up area of 5905 sq.m. The college has 26 classrooms, 12 laboratories, 2 research labs, a language lab, a spacious conference hall, Library and a reading room. Ten classrooms are ICT enabled. Wi-Fi facility available. Separate facility for examination related activity provided. Girls common room facility available. Common Room for Boys needed. The laboratories for Commerce and Computer Science Departments have 80 computers. All departments have computer and internet facility. Out-door sports grounds for Basketball, Volleyball, Kabaddi and Tennikoit are available. A well-equipped Gymnasium and Yoga Centre is available for students. A Multi-purpose Hall and an open stage is available for cultural activities. The library has over 52000 books . Library is fully automated with SOUL and E-Calibre softwares. There are a number of rare books in the library which were published before 1930.N-List and E-calibre access available to students. Remote access to e-resources of the library not available. The college campus is monitored by adequate number of CCTV cameras. Sufficient funds are allocated for maintenance of infrastructure.

Students are benefitted by the scholarships and free-ships provided by the government. Institutional level scholarship is given by the faculty of Commerce and Science to meritorious students. Capability and Enhancement activities like Guidance for Competitive Examinations, Career Counselling, Soft Skill Development, Remedial Coaching, Language Lab, Yoga and Meditation and Personal counselling are available for students. Vocational Training in E-learning, Photography, Power Supply Designing, Tally and DTP, Bag Making has been given to students. The college adopts transparent and timely redressal of student grievances. Placement Cell need to be strengthened and made more functional. Many students are placed in companies like TCS, Airtel, Syntel, Cognizant etc. Student progression is satisfactory. Some students have qualified in NET, SET and state government examinations. Several students have received awards for outstanding performance in sports and cultural activities at national and international level. Chetan Raut, a student of the College could reach 4th place at an international swimming competition. He also swam across the English Channel. The college organizes sports and cultural competitions regularly. The college has an active Student Council and students are provided representation on academic and administrative committees. Alumni Association of Bharatiya Mahavidyalaya Amravati is recently registered. Student's progression to higher education is about 18%. Some of the alumni are well placed and working in different fields. Prominent them include a Pro- Vice Chancellor, Deputy Mayor, Member of Parliament, industrialists, Chartered Accountants, Professors, school teachers, etc.

The government audit is carried out by the Joint Director of Higher Education, the Senior Auditor and audited by the Auditor General of the State periodically. Principal with the support of the IQAC team has enabled the College to progress much during the last five years. Attempts are made by the management for implementation of the recommendations of the 2ndcycle accreditation.
